BrokerCheck offers information on all current, and many former, registered securities brokers, and all current and former registered securities firms. FINRA strongly encourages investors to use BrokerCheck to check the background of securities brokers and brokerage firms before deciding to conduct, or continue to conduct, business with them.

- **What is included in a BrokerCheck report?**

- BrokerCheck reports for individual brokers include information such as employment history, professional qualifications, disciplinary actions, criminal convictions, civil judgments and arbitration awards. BrokerCheck reports for brokerage firms include information on a firm's profile, history, and operations, as well as many of the same disclosure events mentioned above.
- Please note that the information contained in a BrokerCheck report may include pending actions or allegations that may be contested, unresolved or unproven. In the end, these actions or allegations may be resolved in favor of the broker or brokerage firm, or concluded through a negotiated settlement with no admission or finding of wrongdoing.

- **Where did this information come from?**

- The information contained in BrokerCheck comes from FINRA's Central Registration Depository, or CRD® and is a combination of:
 - o information FINRA and/or the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) require brokers and brokerage firms to submit as part of the registration and licensing process, and
 - o information that regulators report regarding disciplinary actions or allegations against firms or brokers.

- **How current is this information?**

- Generally, active brokerage firms and brokers are required to update their professional and disciplinary information in CRD within 30 days. Under most circumstances, information reported by brokerage firms, brokers and regulators is available in BrokerCheck the next business day.

- **What if I want to check the background of an investment adviser firm or investment adviser representative?**

- To check the background of an investment adviser firm or representative, you can search for the firm or individual in BrokerCheck. If your search is successful, click on the link provided to view the available licensing and registration information in the SEC's Investment Adviser Public Disclosure (IAPD) website at <https://www.adviserinfo.sec.gov>. In the alternative, you may search the IAPD website directly or contact your state securities regulator at <http://www.finra.org/Investors/ToolsCalculators/BrokerCheck/P455414>.

- **Are there other resources I can use to check the background of investment professionals?**

- FINRA recommends that you learn as much as possible about an investment professional before deciding to work with them. Your state securities regulator can help you research brokers and investment adviser representatives doing business in your state.

Broker Statement THIS COMPLAINT AROSE FROM THE UNFORESEEN WIDESPREAD FAILURE OF THE AUCTIONS IN THE STUDENT LOAN AUCTION RATE SECURITIES MARKET. THE SETTLEMENT REFLECTS DEUTSCHE BANK'S DECISION TO BUY BACK THE SECURITIES FROM THE CLIENT AT PAR.



THE DEUTSCHE BANK CLIENT ADVISOR THAT I SUPPORTED AT THE TIME WORKED WITH [CUSTOMER], SINCE 2006. THE INVESTMENT POLICY STATEMENT GOVERNING THIS RELATIONSHIP EXPRESSLY AUTHORIZED INVESTING IN AUCTION RATE SECURITIES. ALL CONVERSATIONS BETWEEN OXPS AND THE DEUTSCHE BANK CLIENT ADVISOR OR ME RELATING TO THE INVESTMENT QUALITY OF AUCTION RATE SECURITIES ONLY RELATED TO WHETHER THE SECURITY WAS FFELP SUPPORTED OR NOT.

IN DECEMBER 2007, I WAS INSTRUCTED BY THE DEUTSCHE BANK CLIENT ADVISOR THAT I SUPPORTED TO SELL ALL NON-100% FFELP SUPPORTED AUCTION RATE SECURITIES IN THE CLIENT'S PORTFOLIO AS A RESULT OF A CONVERSATION HE HAD WITH [CUSTOMER]. SUBSEQUENTLY, I EXECUTED AND CONFIRMED THE TRADES WITH THE CLIENT AS I WAS INSTRUCTED. IN NOVEMBER 2009, [CUSTOMER] FILED A WRITTEN COMPLAINT WITH DEUTSCHE BANK INDICATING THAT [CUSTOMER] INSTRUCTED THEIR CLIENT ADVISOR IN A CONVERSATION TO SELL AUCTION RATE SECURITIES OTHER THAN THOSE THAT WERE 100% FFELP SUPPORTED. BY THIS POINT IN TIME, THE AUCTION RATE SECURITIES MARKET HAD BECOME STRUCTURALLY IMPAIRED AS A RESULT OF THE CREDIT CRISES THAT DEVASTATED THE LIQUIDITY FOR THESE TYPES OF SECURITIES. DUE TO THESE FACTS, I BELIEVE THE COMPLAINT TO BE BASELESS. IN THE END, DEUTSCHE BANK AGREED TO PURCHASE THE SECURITIES BACK FROM [CUSTOMER] AT PAR TO SATISFY THE COMPLAINT OF A VALUED CLIENT.
