- **What is included in a BrokerCheck report?**

- BrokerCheck reports for individual brokers include information such as employment history, professional qualifications, disciplinary actions, criminal convictions, civil judgments and arbitration awards. BrokerCheck reports for brokerage firms include information on a firm's profile, history, and operations, as well as many of the same disclosure events mentioned above.
- Please note that the information contained in a BrokerCheck report may include pending actions or allegations that may be contested, unresolved or unproven. In the end, these actions or allegations may be resolved in favor of the broker or brokerage firm, or concluded through a negotiated settlement with no admission or finding of wrongdoing.

- **Where did this information come from?**

- The information contained in BrokerCheck comes from FINRA's Central Registration Depository, or CRD® and is a combination of:
 - o information FINRA and/or the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) require brokers and brokerage firms to submit as part of the registration and licensing process, and
 - o information that regulators report regarding disciplinary actions or allegations against firms or brokers.

- **How current is this information?**

- Generally, active brokerage firms and brokers are required to update their professional and disciplinary information in CRD within 30 days. Under most circumstances, information reported by brokerage firms, brokers and regulators is available in BrokerCheck the next business day.

- **What if I want to check the background of an investment adviser firm or investment adviser representative?**

- To check the background of an investment adviser firm or representative, you can search for the firm or individual in BrokerCheck. - **Are there other resources I can use to check the background of investment professionals?**

- FINRA recommends that you learn as much as possible about an investment professional before deciding to work with them. Your state securities regulator can help you research brokers and investment adviser representatives doing business in your state.

My private client banker and I met with the clients on the 29th of January to discuss their allocation and what was causing the recent market fluctuation. I explained that there was uncertainty in the market at that point and that my advice to them was to stay with their current allocation. They understood so I was surprised when I received a phone call from the client on February 11. The client was extremely anxious of the decline in value since we had last spoke. At that point, I asked them if they could come into the office to discuss in greater detail, and we scheduled an appointment for that afternoon. My banker and I met with the clients that afternoon and that is when they asked again about our thoughts on what they should do. I told them that fluctuation is normal and that over time I believe that their current allocation had the possibility to provide a good return if they held their positions. However, I want to make sure that all of my clients are comfortable with their allocations. After about 5 minutes of discussing it amongst themselves, they said they understood but couldn't handle the fluctuations anymore. They told me to liquidate all of the holdings in the account and to provide them with suggestions on safer returns. After I received the liquidation order, I asked them twice if they were sure they wanted to liquidate, both times they answered with yes. So, I placed the trade while they were sitting at my desk. After the trades were placed, he asked the value of the account. I explained that mutual funds trade using the end of business day values and they have a one day settlement. I explained that we would have an exact value at the first of the following week. That is when I suggested we set an appointment for that week to discuss what to do with the proceeds. The appointment was set for Thursday, February 18th. We briefly discussed fixed rate options for principal protection but agreed to go over that in greater detail on the 18th. It is my obligation to place a trade order as it is received and I take it very seriously. Again, my banker was there to confirm all trade requests.
